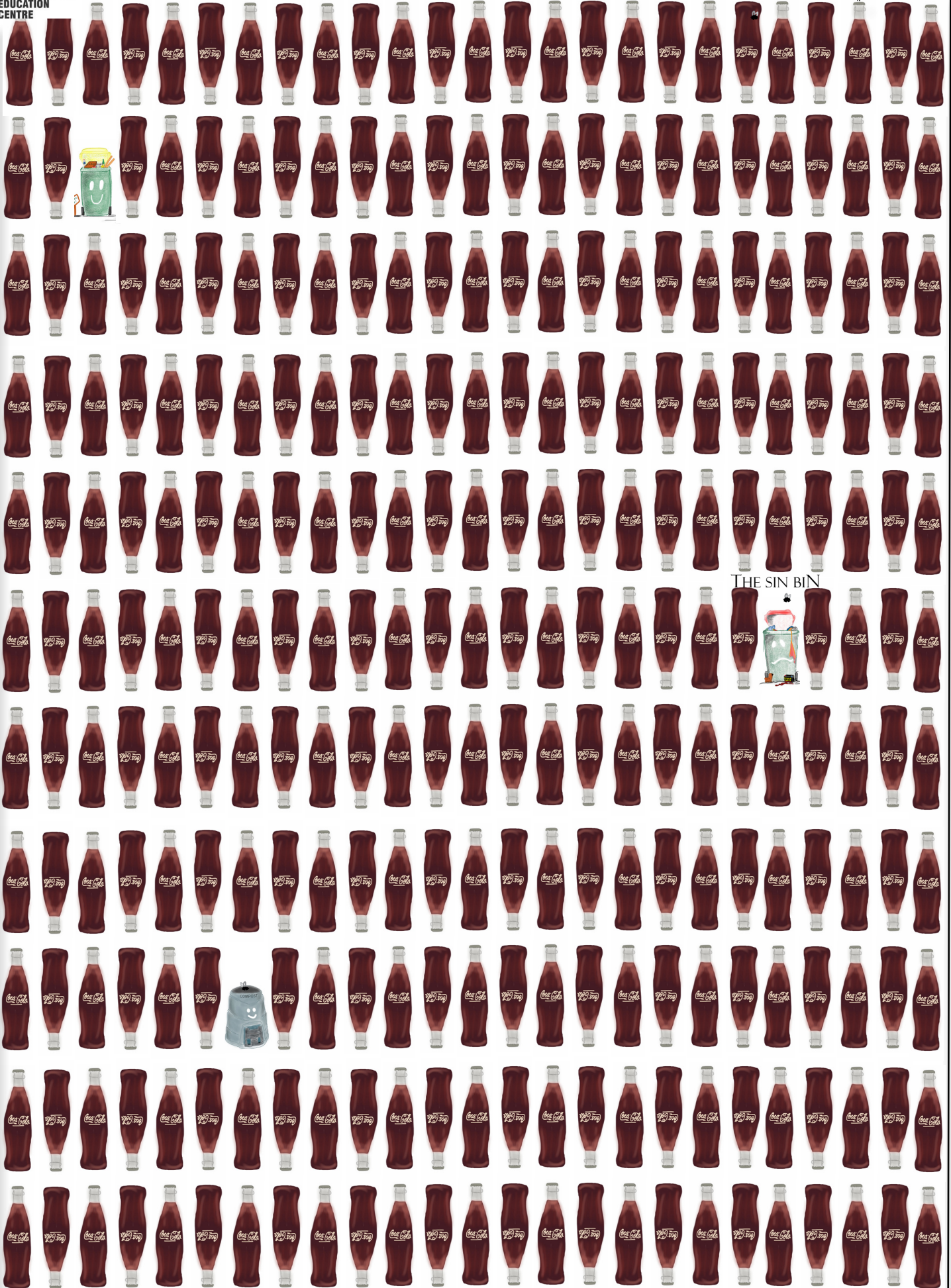

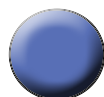
On the 5th of June 2013 year 7 students from Ulladulla High School spent a whirlwind day partaking in activities about the environment. Read this article written by one of their students.

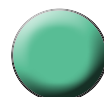

TRASH TALK... CONVERSATIONS ACROSS THE REGION

And the trash talk continues... Over the past month plenty has been happening in our local shire areas especially in building relationships with councils and local schools. Here are just a few examples to keep you in the loop!

Bega Valley Shire - Toby Browne has organised local transfer stations to set aside bath tubs, screen doors and spare peices of wood to assist in the construction of 6 worm farms for Bega Valley Primary School. Toby has also met with the Bournda EEC to discuss his involvement in education programs for the local high schools.

Goulburn Mulwaree Shire - Teena Riley and Tracey Norberg attended the 'Can you help the Sin Bin?' workshop held at Goulburn TAFE. Both Teena and Tracey met with teachers from Yass and Goulburn high schools.
